The successful candidate will join a team of researchers dedicated to cutting-edge research, collaborative work, and teaching on innovative aspects of the International Relations of the EU.

Requirements:

- PhD graduate in political science (or a neighbouring and related discipline) (graduation at the latest in winter 2024)
- Proven skills regarding publishing in highly renowned, pertinent journals and publishing houses
- Affinity and high level of knowledge concerning European integration
- Proficiency in English, competence in spoken and written German is an asset
